Two lives changed in Ukraine because you shared Bibles

The woman at the well

A woman had been coming to get water from a well week after week.

Across Ukraine, Russian forces have turned off the water system in occupied areas, leaving whole cities with no clean tap water. Our partner Samaritan's Purse has drilled wells and set up water distribution centres, mostly based in local churches. These water stations have become key distribution points for both physical supplies and Ukrainian Ribles

Every time this woman, an older lady, came to the water point, the church's pastor would greet her and say, "How are you? It's very nice to see you. Would you like to come in and sit and talk?"

But she always said, "No, thank you. I'll take my water and go."

This went on for months. Then one day, the woman said, "I'll take you up on that chat offer." So they sat down and talked about all the loss she had suffered. The people she knew who had been killed in the war. Her stories were hard to hear.

Then she broke down and said, "I don't know what to do. I come here every week for water. I go and drink the water. But I just don't know why I'm still alive."

The pastor was reminded so much of the woman that Jesus met by the well in Samaria; he told her about the abundant life that Jesus offers. The woman trusted Jesus and accepted the offer of salvation right there.

She has attended church every Sunday since. And every time she comes in and gets her water, she still sits and talks with the pastor. She has a beautiful zest for life now, and she's passionate about Christ.

The soldier who came to Jesus

Ilgar has been fighting for two years as a Ukrainian soldier. He's from a Muslim family and had never heard the Gospel.

He looks like a tough guy, covered in tattoos. But something happened to him while he was fighting that shook his worldview... he narrowly escaped death four times.

"The first time, I put it down to chance," he said. "The second time, it made me pause for a second and think maybe there's something protecting me".

It happened for a third time, but the fourth was the most dramatic.

"I was standing in position and just stepped aside by four steps and a missile landed on the very spot I had been standing! I was thrown by the shockwave and the jacket I was wearing was shredded by shrapnel, but I didn't have a scratch on me. That's when I knew it was a miracle."

When he came home for a weekend, his friend from school invited him to a Bible study at a Christian community house run by our partner Steiger.

Ilgar said, "After all this had happened, I knew I had to come - I needed to know this God who kept rescuing me."

At the Bible study, Ilgar was given his first copy of the Bible. He was shown the Ukrainian Bible app too, and the group explained he could access the Bible at any time.

For the next couple of months, somebody from Steiger regularly met up with Ilgar to read the Bible together.

One Sunday, the study leader asked if anyone wanted to give their life to Jesus. Ilgar put up his hand, then came and knelt down. He was physically shaking as he received Jesus right there.

Laughing, he said, "If you told me a year ago that I would be at a Christian gathering, I would have smacked you in the face!"

Ilgar is now on a rest period from the army, and he's spending his time with this Christian community in Kyiv, growing in faith and learning how to live a new life.

"Sometimes I sit back and I'm just in awe. There have been times when I've had tears rolling down my cheeks thinking, this is so beautiful."

George Sneddon is the minister of a small church on a housing estate outside Glasgow. When he arrived in 2022, things were very quiet. Following the pandemic, any sense of community on the estate had dwindled away. The church had reopened, but people hadn't come back.

Something needed to change.

A different sort of Bible

At a conference George discovered a book called Love, Death and Resurrection. He went home and opened it up.

"I just loved it!" says George. "The way that it's structured, it's not your typical Bible - I felt like I was reading a novel instead. Before I knew it, I'd read 110 pages. To be honest, I've never found the Bible that easy to read, and I've done a Masters in Theology!"

Love, Death and Resurrection is Biblica's special edition of the New Testament, designed, in partnership with the Scottish Bible Society, for reading together like a book group. The traditional headings, columns, chapter and verse numbers have been removed, and the books are put together in a different order, allowing the story to flow more like a novel.

George hadn't experienced the Bible in this way before. But he saw that this might be just what his Glasgow neighbourhood needed.



An explosion of faith

When a new couple started coming to the church on the estate, George lent them his copy of *Love, Death and Resurrection*. They went home and read it with their family. Then they came back and said they would buy 200 copies for the church!

Armed with the books, George started running a group after the Sunday service called 'Look at the Book'. Every week, they meet like a book group to read and discuss a page together.

"The transformation in people's faith has been incredible!" says George. "Most of the people that come had disengaged with church. This has brought them new intimacy with God; it has given space for the Holy Spirit to lead and teach... and people have wanted to become part of this bigger thing that we call the church because they want to get to know Jesus. That's why the church has grown."

A book for the whole estate

And the Word has spread beyond the church. This New Testament has gone everywhere on the estate. The congregation loved it so much that they raised funds to buy copies for their neighbours.

One time, George went to visit a widow in her nineties whom he'd never met before. "I was sitting in this lady's living room talking, and I noticed on her shelf a copy of Love, Death and Resurrection that I certainly hadn't given her! I find them all over the estate. This Bible experience is bringing the community back together."

Let's pray that everybody who is reading the Bible for the very first time today will hear God speaking to them.

Translation update

The latest progress on getting God's Word to everyone, everywhere



Al crosses a new frontier

An estimated 9 million people speak a Southeast Asian dialect which has never had the Scriptures. This dialect seems to have been hidden from Bible translation efforts until now, and our workers experienced lots of obstacles to getting a translation project underway.

Finally, a few months ago, we began training a team to use an Al-assisted translation approach to get the Scriptures into this forgotten dialect as soon as possible. The Al translation software can produce a first draft about five times faster than traditional methods. Then, the draft will be carefully checked and worked on by the team of human translators, including expert Bible scholars and native speakers of the dialect, making sure the meaning has carried through correctly.

The translators learned the tool well at our training week and were excited to get started.

One of them, a native speaker of this dialect, reflected: "Before, it was like there was a dark spirit hiding us from Bible translators. We are so thankful that you are now bringing us the light."

Updated Portuguese translation launches in Brazil

Biblica's Brazil team were in Rio de Janeiro this summer to launch a new, updated version (the Nova Versao Internacional) in Portuguese.

The Portuguese translation hadn't been updated for over 20 years, and everybody is delighted with the new version which uses contemporary language and the NIV's current, more methodical translation methods and standards.

Off the page

For many people around the world, it will never be possible to read the Bible in their native, heart language! Why not? Either their language is an oral (spoken) language or sign language with no written form, or they can't read well. But reading isn't the only way to experience the Bible.

In India, Biblica partners with Faith Comes by Hearing and Tree of Life to create and provide audio Bibles to people like Kovindraj.

Kovindraj was paralysed, unable to walk or speak clearly. He experienced the tragedy of his daughter passing away, but it didn't affect his faith. After receiving an audio player with Biblica's Tamil Contemporary New Testament on it, Kovindraj and his family started listening to the Word of God every day.

As he listened to the New Testament in his heart language, Kovindraj sensed Yesappa (Jesus) tell him that he could walk and speak. The voice of Jesus gave him hope and, growing in his faith, Kovindraj would soon act upon it.

One day, Kovindraj got up and started walking! Soon enough he started speaking as well. Although slurring a bit, he could now communicate. He began to engage in conversation with family and friends, saying: "Yesappa Nallavar", meaning: "Jesus is good."

How Amir found the truth online

"Something attracted me so much that I needed to know more."

Nearly half a million people visit Biblica's Arabic outreach website every month. Our skilled partners speak to visitors over social media, helping to answer their questions and guide them if they want to follow Jesus.

Amir*, a 25 year-old Egyptian, was magnetically attracted to the love, peace, outreach and church rituals that he saw in Christianity. He kept searching YouTube and the internet to find out more. He just couldn't leave it alone.

Biblica's website was really helpful for him. He was hungry to examine the Bible, so he requested a free copy and asked if he could have help to understand anything that confused him. We soon realised Amir had already read the Gospel of John and parts of Luke.

Chatting online, we explained that at the heart of Christianity is a restored relationship with God, not just a religion. He saw how God's justice and mercy came together at the cross. After six months, Amir asked in the chat: "What do you advise me to do? How do I start my path? I am truly convinced in my heart, but with a terrible conflict as the matter is not easy." Amir's family and friends were all Muslim, and it was a serious matter to profess faith in Jesus. "I feel very much that I have met Christ and I love him," he said, "but I still need time."

We encouraged him to take it step by step. His next step right then was to pray a beautiful prayer of commitment to Christ. Biblica will continue to support him confidentially in his new Christian life.
